This blurb is one that is in every bulletin right before the names of staff are listed. I love this statement because it reinforces the priesthood of all believers. As a programming staff, we are at our best when our work props up the work of the congregation. We are called to serve the local parish, their needs, their desires, and their visions.

Often times congregations run into the problem of relying too heavily on their staff. They wait for the staff to have leadership roles in all church activities, or they only volunteer for things when they are harassed repeatedly. The work of the church becomes synonymous with the work of the staff.

I don't think this is the issue at UPC, but I know we can do better as a congregation to fully embody the role as ministers to one another and the community of Peoria. You, reading this article, are a minister. You have been called to service. You have been called to love your sisters and brothers of UPC, to share in the journey of faith, to be a witness to the love of Christ, and to be guided by the Holy Spirit to bring life and wholeness to the relationships and places where you find yourself.

One of the ministries at UPC is to provide two worship services a month at Independence Village, an independent living facility near the church. With the loss of a pastor, we recently had to drop down to offering one worship service a month. Two men in the congregation, who volunteer every service at Independence Village ,decided to remedy this problem by taking it upon themselves to lead that extra service. They got someone living at Independence Village to help them with the service and they asked Rick Noetzel to provide music for them. These men saw a need and they connected their passion of helping this community with a practical effort to fill this need. Their passion directed them to action. This story is an example of congregants living into their identity as the priesthood of all believers. They are the ministers in this situation.

I encourage you to look deep into what your passions are. Where is God tugging at you? What makes you so excited where you find yourself continually revisiting it in your mind?

The church is at its best when everyone in it can claim their passions and connect it with the life of the church; ministering as the priesthood of all believers.

BUNCO



SUICIDE...

You might be tempted to stop reading, but please, DON'T STOP READING:

- Suicide is the second leading cause of death among 15-29 year olds
- Close to 800,000 people die due to suicide every year
- For every suicide there are many more people who attempt suicide every year
- Every suicide is a tragedy that affects families, communities and has long-lasting effects on the people left behind.
- While the link between suicide and mental disorders (in particular, depression and alcohol use disorders) is well established, many suicides happen impulsively in moments of crisis with a breakdown in the ability to deal with life stresses, such as financial problems, relationship break-up or chronic pain and illness.
- Experiencing conflict, disaster, violence, abuse, or loss and a sense of isolation are strongly associated with suicidal behavior.
- Suicide rates are high among vulnerable groups who experience discrimination, such as refugees and migrants; indigenous peoples; lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex (LGBTI) persons; and prisoners.
- Suicide is a serious public health problem.

September 10, is World Suicide Prevention Day. On this date, you are invited to join all faith communities across the nation to pray for those whose lives have been touched by suicide. Pray that those struggling have a voice. Pray that those struggling can grow in faith and find hope. Pledge to be aware of those around you who are struggling with any of life's challenges. Pray especially for those who have been affected in any way by suicide. Pray for those experiencing feelings of hopelessness that they may find love and care. STILL READING? You are already affecting change. Awareness is a key. I challenge you to use September 10 as a starting point. Continue to keep those with physical health concerns in your daily prayers, but add those with mental health concerns, too. Prayer is an easy way to help and an easy place to start. It's time to break the silence around suicide and help all who struggle.

Stephen Ministry

Why is Stephen Ministry important?

First, it helps the congregation and the ministry of that congregation. We are now in the process of calling a new minister, and I think a selling point for our church is to have a strong program in place. Having Stephen Ministry says that we are a caring congregation who believes that we are all ministers and follow Christ's lead. As I stated, a person in the church needs to feel loved and cared for and it doesn't necessarily have to be the minister. Since we have only one ministry position in our church, it is now more important than ever that our Stephen Ministry remain strong.

Second, it helps people who are in a crisis. While we tend to think of crisis times as being bad news, it doesn't necessarily have to be. Any life change can bring about a crisis for people. Death of a spouse or close loved one can be a crisis situation. Losing a home to weather or fire can be a crisis. But taking on a new job or feeling overwhelmed by the birth of a new baby can also be a crisis. People undergoing crisis need ongoing help in order to cope. They need to see the love of Jesus shown in the face of another.

Finally, being a Stephen Minister helps deepen your faith. In training, you learn to listen, to pray with another, and to be assertive in order to help another cope with a crisis. When I went to Leader Training, I didn't know what to expect. The first night we were assigned a prayer partner, and were told to meet daily to pray for one another. That was something I had never done before. But the experience deepened my prayer life and to share Christ's love with another.

We currently have an active Stephen Ministry, but for it to remain active, we need more volunteers. Therefore, we are starting a new training class this fall. Please step out in boldness and commit yourself to being a Stephen Minister. If you don't feel that is your talent or calling, pray for the continued success of our Stephen Ministry program.
